What is naloxone?

- Naloxone is a medication that can block the effects of opioids on the brain and reverse an overdose by quickly restoring breathing when administered in time during an opioid overdose.
- Naloxone is safe and has no potential for abuse. If naloxone is given to a person who is not experiencing an opioid overdose, it is harmless.
- If naloxone is administered to a person who is dependent on opioids, it will produce withdrawal symptoms.
- Naloxone does not reverse overdoses that are caused by alcohol, cocaine, benzodiazepines, methamphetamine, or other non-opioid drugs.
